Level of difficulty within category (Airplane):

(not all criteria have to be met; judging team decides together on the given point)

1 point: without strut bars or (weapon) pilons, single-deck, single-engined aircraft (eg. sports gliders, V-1, Bachem Natter, Me-163 Komet, Zlin-50, Horsa)

2 points: without strut bars, with (weapon) pilons, single-engined airplane (eg. Spitfire, Yak-9, Mustang, FW 190, MiG-15, MiG-21, F-86 Sabre, Mirage-III, F-) 16)

3 points: without strut bars, with (weapon) pilons, single-deck, maximum 3 engined airplane (eg. Me-210, Pe-2, P-38, Mosquito, Dakota, II-14, Tu-154, B-17, B-52)

4 points: with strut bars, with (weapon) pilons, multi-deck, single-engined airplane equipped (eg. Camel, An-2, Swordfish, Po-2, CR.32)

5 points: with strut bars, with (weapon) pilons, minimum 4 engined aircraft (eg. Gigant, DO-X, Vickers Vimy, HP 0/400)

Level of difficulty in painting (Airplane):

(not all criteria have to be met; judging team decides together on the given point)

1 point: single colour aircraft

2 points: two-colour camouflage scheme with hard edge color separation, single colour on the bottom.

3 points: three or more colours, soft edge camouflage scheme, single colour (painted or natural metal) on the bottom.

4 points: squiggle pattern, tiny blotches of camouflage, small square (eg. Viggen) camouflage scheme.

5 points: custom, artistic (Demo or demonstration) paintings (eg. Mi-24 Csőrike), painting of passenger airplanes (eg. Il-14 MALÉV) in case no decals were used.

In special cases, the jury will decide according to the guidelines described above. (For example, in case of a model where all the service panels are opened, to give more points for level of difficulty within category than 1.)
